GVHA was informed today by PCC that our concept to manage and operate the CPR Steamship building was selected as the preferred proposal. Our submission was made possible thanks to the hard work and ingenuity of many talented and dedicated professionals who collaborated to develop a sound and sustainable business case and operational concept for this iconic building. We wish to thank everyone for their support in bringing it all together, under pressure!

We look forward to working with the harbour stakeholders, including the PCC, our local First Nations and the City of Victoria, to restore the CPR terminal to its former glory as an active, vibrant public space and marine transportation/tourism hub.

Initially, GVHA will be focused on re-opening the CPR terminal with highly capable and experienced food, beverage and retail operators, which will serve as a stepping stone to advance our plans for a consolidated common-use ferry terminal. Ultimately, our objective is to establish a world-class and sustainable marine transportation and tourism gateway for the region.

Having advanced to this critical stage in the process, we are eager to roll up our sleeves and get down to business. Once the agreement is settled and signed with the PCC, we will immediately launch an expedited process to select the most appropriate and compelling concepts for the CPR terminal.
